ABOUT:

The New York School-Based Health Foundation is building a data repository and analytic tools for New York State's School-Based Health Centers (SBHCs). The Data Hub is possibly the most important strategy for the future of New York's SBHCs.

For the first time ever, New York's SBHCs will join other health care sectors in having data to:

- Identify gaps in care
- Document outcomes
- Improve operations*
- Advocate for SBHC value

*The Data Hub Program also supports electronic submission of State quarterly reports, saving SBHCs many hours of manual work.

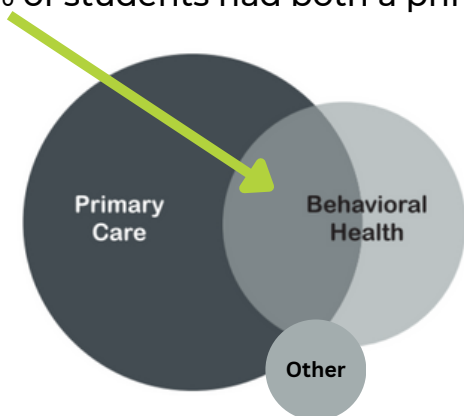

In 2021-22, 11 Sponsor Organizations operating 111 SBHCs documented 205,427 visits for 52,212 patients in the Data Hub.

DATA TO HIGHLIGHT THE SBHC MODEL:

SBHCs provide primary health care, behavioral health care, and dental services to all students, regardless of their ability to pay. Among our first 11 Data Hub participating organizations, 17% of students had both a primary care and a behavioral health visit.



VISITS, BY TYPE

- 58% Primary Care
- 25% Behavioral Health
- 17% Other

Primary care visits include acute care, child well exams, immunizations, sports physicals, and reproductive health care.

Behavioral health visits include services for screening, counseling, and treating students' emotional, social, and psychological health. The top behavioral health diagnoses encountered are anxiety and adjustment disorders.

THE DATA HUB IS GROWING:

As of January 2023, 12 sponsoring organizations operating 117 SBHCs (47% of all New York's SBHCs) are participating in the Data Hub Program.
