

At A Glance: New York State NYSBHF Data Hub School-Based Health Centers and School- Based Dental Operators

School Year 2024-2025



Across New York State, approximately 250 school-based health centers (SBHCs) provide care to some 250,000 public school students. These centers offer a wide range of services for children regardless of their family's financial situation or insurance status. Located in schools in under-resourced areas, SBHCs deliver essential care where it's most needed—right at school. School-Based Health Centers provide comprehensive, high-quality preventive, oral health, behavioral health, and primary care for our preschool through high school students.



Services are provided on site by a multidisciplinary team of medical, dental, and behavioral health professionals sponsored by highly regulated Article 28 entities including Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs), hospitals, and community-based healthcare organizations.



For many children, our SBHCs are the only care they receive. We know that children seen in SBHCs have fewer absences, higher grade performance, and higher graduation rates. The care that SBHCs give will affect many children for their lifetime.

Thanks to a project from the New York School-Based Health Foundation (NYSBHF) in collaboration with Apex Evaluation, we are able to provide sponsor organization, county, and

SBHC-level data about the students served and care received. The Data Hub is the only publicly-available data source in New York State with de-identified patient-level school-health data, allowing for deeper understanding of the role, impact, and importance of our SBHCs.

- **26%** Missing, unknown, or other



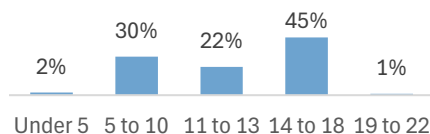
By Gender ¹

- **48%** Male

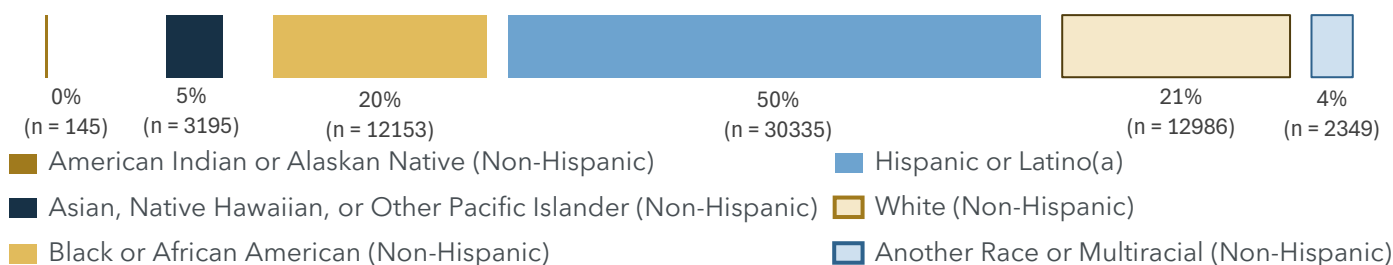

By Age



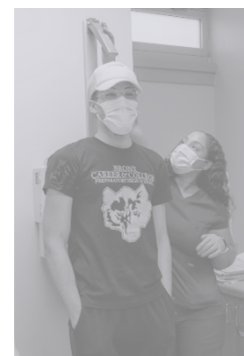
By Race/Ethnicity ²



What types of care do our students receive? ³



- **48,637** students received **general wellness care** (e.g. visits for well-being, health education, check-ups and physicals)
- **36,997** students received **acute care**
- **15,428** students received **behavioral health care**
- **15,305** students received **reproductive health care**
- **17,877** students received **an immunization visit**
- **12,194** students received **dental care**



Why are our students using our SBHC?

Medical Care ³

210,917 medical care visits included:

- 13%** for Comprehensive Physical Exams
- 21%** for Chronic Disease
- 44%** for Acute Care
- 14%** for Reproductive Health
- 12%** for Immunizations

Behavioral Health Care ³

91,697 behavioral health visits included:

- 46%** for Adjustment Disorder diagnoses
- 13%** for Depression diagnoses
- 21%** for Anxiety diagnoses
- 32%** for other reasons (e.g. ADHD, Mood Disorders, ect.)
