New York's School-Based Health Centers

New York's 253 SBHCs operate in underserved rural and urban communities across the state of New York, collectively serving over 250,000 students.



School-Based Health Centers

School-Based Health Centers provide care to any student with no out-of-pocket cost. They break health barriers by requiring no extra transportation to students, and being located in under-resourced districts.



Care Integration

SBHCs are staffed by multi-disciplinary teams of medical, dental, and behavioral health professionals who work alongside school staff to deliver coordinated support. They help to improve attendance, learning, and graduation rates.



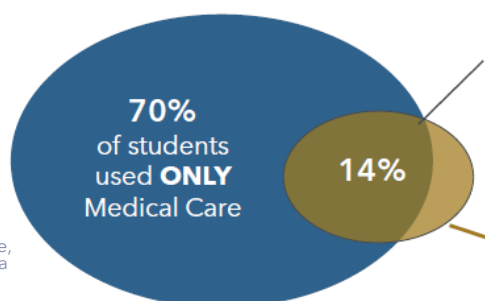
The New York School-Based Health Foundation Data Hub

This year's annual SBHC Data Hub Profile report features data from 126 SBHCs and their 12 Sponsoring Organizations (SOs) that participate in the Data Hub, representing 50% of New York State's total SBHCs.

It shows the care and services received by over **65,000** student patients in over **250,000 SBHC visits**. The Data Hub provides the only publicly available source of statewide and comparative data.

SBHCs are a One-Stop Shop!

*Venn Diagram does not include students that only received dental care, nor students that received services at a Data Hub SBHC but the clinical codes (i.e., reason for the visit) was not recorded. Thus, it totals to less than 100%.



While many students come to the SBHC for just one type of service, **14%** of SBHC users **used both medical and behavioral health care services at their SBHC.**

6% of students used **ONLY** Behavioral Health Care

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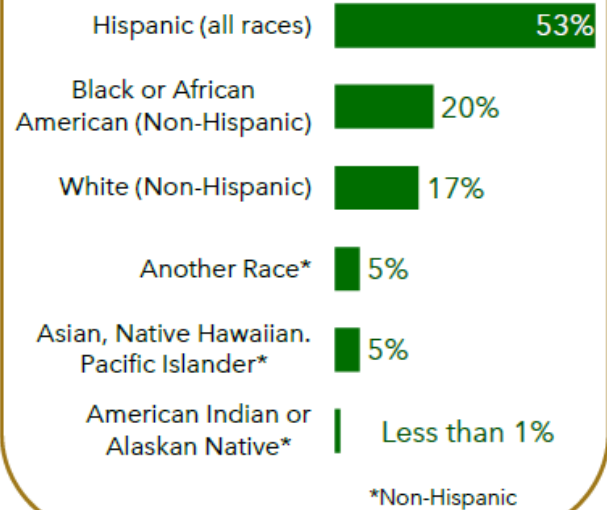

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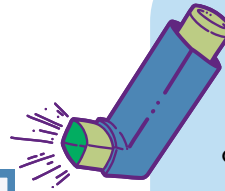


73% of students served identify as Hispanic or Black²

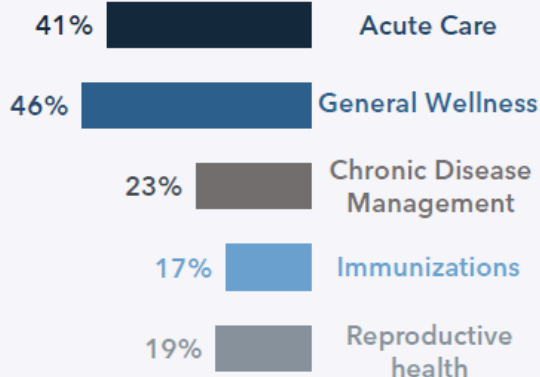
Most Data Hub SBHCs are in urban communities, where a greater proportion of community members are Hispanic and/or Black compared to rural areas of NY, skewing the statewide total.³



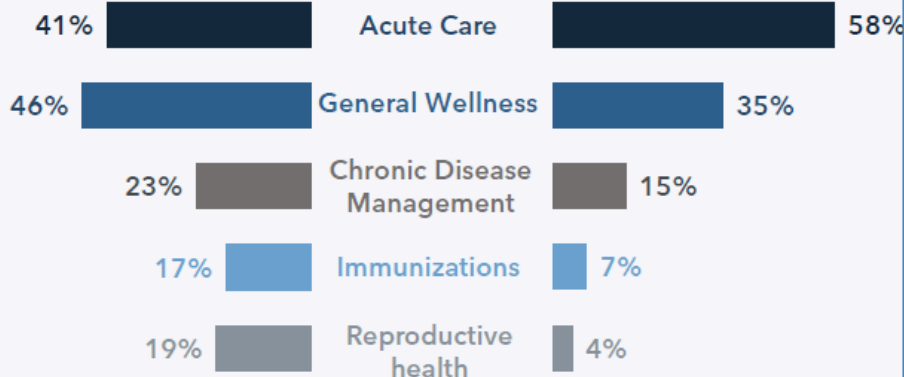
28% of Data Hub users — 18,293 students — have one or more **chronic disease** diagnosis. The most common diagnoses included obesity, asthma, and dental caries (e.g., cavities, gingivitis).



Medical Diagnoses at Urban SBHCs¹

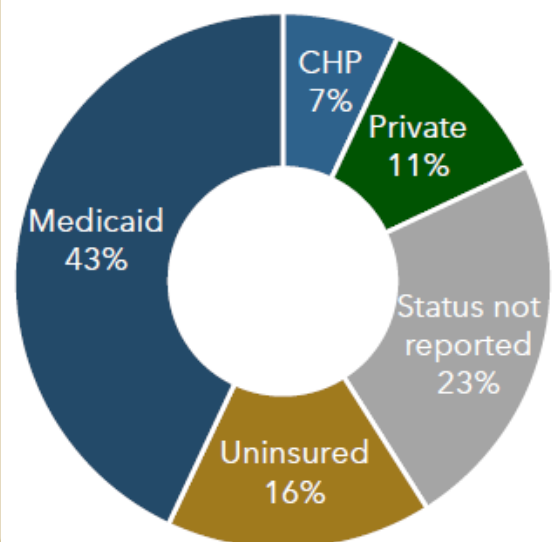


Medical Diagnoses at Rural SBHCs¹

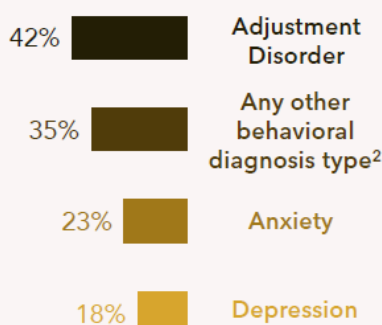


Half of students served use Medicaid or Child Health Plus
